Greetings to All from Sister Baptista:



We have new staff at Tetekela this year. Six children have been selected to grade 8 and will need about K8,235.00 (\$1264.69 USD) to pay for school fees. The Centre will also need to pay for the grade 9 pupils who are awaiting the results plus those who are in formal school. Feeding the children is still a priority.

We have revamped the garden and opened a tuck shop (a small general

store) in the container (sent in 2010 by HFZ) for income generation. We have moved the piggery to the farm in view of using the former piggery house for poultry. One hector of maize has been cultivated with an expected yield of 100-150 50 kg bags.

There are some major challenges. Volunteers are needed to help with teaching computers and games. Repair and maintenance of buildings is badly needed, and surrounding walls are falling down.

The only source of financial support currently for Tetekela Center is Hearts for Zambia. Thank you to all the generous hearts who have supported the fundraising work of Hearts for Zambia. You make our service with the children possible.

I was born in 1999 in the city of Lusaka. After some years my mother died and I moved from Lusaka to Mpulungu with my father who was sick, and he later died. I was taken by my cousin who lives in Kasama. I was then 6 years old.



Because my cousin was

also young, she could not afford to pay for my school fees and my uniform, so she took me to Tetekela Day Center.


There I started school in class one which is preschool. When the teaching staff found me performing well in class, they recommended going to a formal school at Mubanga Chipoya. Living with my cousin is not easy because she now has her children to look after. I don't receive much support from her apart from a shelter. Because of the Tetekela Day Center program, I have been helped to continue school. Tetekela has helped me spiritually through prayers and physically through food, clothing and school materials. At school I am now in grade 8 doing well.
